Dear Newcomer,

Hello and welcome to the Unitarian Universalist Community Church of Santa Monica! We are so glad you are thinking about joining this community. And by "we" I mean myself, the church congregation, staff, and the Board of Trustees.

My family and I came to UCCSM in March in 2007, when I was pregnant with my third kid and looking for a spiritual community. My husband and I had different spiritual upbringings, and we were looking for something to appeal to both of our perspectives. I wanted deep connection with a group connected to environmental and climate justice, whereas my husband wanted more spirituality. We joined along with good friends of ours whose kids were of a similar age. As parents, we all felt our school-age kids needed to be in a community to provide grounding. Now, I have two young adults and a pre-teen who have UU values in their bones! I love participating with other church members to express our values in political action and climate justice work. I love attending the worship service on Sundays, and going to Camp de Benneville Pines, our shared spiritual retreat in the mountains. I am so grateful to be in this community of learning and loving!



Unitarian Universalism is a values-based religion, where all religious beliefs are welcome. We have no creed, but we do have Seven Principles and Six Sources that guide us in spiritual development (i.e., seeking to become one's best self, whatever the path may be). At the heart of our community is the covenant, recited at the beginning of every Sunday worship service: "Love is the doctrine of this church, the quest for truth is its sacrament, and service is its prayer. To dwell together in peace, to seek knowledge in freedom, to serve humankind in fellowship, thus do we covenant with each other."

- ◆ Become a volunteer using your skills and talents in our church community.



For over 90 years, UUSM has been a center for the practice of liberal religion offered in a welcoming and diverse environment. We seek to provide you with a spiritual home that nourishes you personally. There are so many ways to enjoy and benefit from this community – including Sunday worship services, religious education programs for children as well as adults, an active social justice and service group, and many other opportunities to serve, learn and grow within our church and the larger community.

IT IS IMPORTANT TO KNOW THAT UUSM IS SELF-SUPPORTING

UUSM members are entirely responsible for the financial well-being of our church. We receive no regular funding from our denomination, outside philanthropy organizations, or grants.



Your financial pledge supports:

- 70% of UUSM's expenses – from staff salaries (for example, our minister, music director, and religious education director) to our many programs, church maintenance and much more.
- The other 30% of our income comes from fundraising events, rental income, contributions and gifts.

WHAT WILL MY GIVING SUPPORT?

Worship & Music: 37% Sunday Worship that reaches almost 500 people weekly and our prophetic, liberal voice in the world.

Providing a Community Center: 29% Maintenance & custodial care of grounds and sacred spaces.

Social Justice and Service: 11% Community programs that put our faith in action.

Lifelong Learning: 11% Educational activities for over 300 children, youth, & adults.

Congregational Life: 10% Member activities, services, programs, pastoral care.

UUA Connections: 2% Annual Association & District dues.

HOW MUCH SHOULD I GIVE?

It costs approximately \$1,600 per household per year to cover the above costs – and to sustain all that our church offers us. We hope that you will give as generously as you can – pledging more if you are able on behalf of those with lesser means, so that we all may enjoy community.
