
Dr. Ghazala Anwar has been supporting queer rights and animal rights since the early 1990s when she was a graduate student at Temple University. She led a mixed-gender prayer at an al-Fatiha conference in New York in 1998 and was quoted in the New York Times as saying that Islam and homosexuality were compatible. In 2003 she led a public Friday prayers at Salaam conference in Toronto and in her sermon she urged the queer community to organize their own Friday services which became the inspiration for the Tawheed Juma circle. She similarly inspired the Inclusive Mosque Initiative in the UK. In 2006 she was the first person to be quoted in the Pakistani press as supporting the rights of women, religious minorities and sexual minorities. As a scholar and professor of Quranic Studies she supports an open, critical and intimate engagement with Quranic texts from a queer, animal and earth rights perspective. and for the past two years has offered free Quranic studies classes for the queer Muslim community online.
